Foreword

Black holes in space are a bit of a mystery: They have a mass so great, and a gravitational pull so strong, that even light cannot escape them. When an object hurtles past a black hole's "event horizon" (an invisible boundary that marks a gravitational point of no return), that object will be irretrievably captured. There is no going back.

In Romans the Apostle Paul tells us that everything in the created world is a metaphor for God's "invisible qualities, his eternal power and divine nature" (Romans 1:20). So, what if the dynamics of a black hole are a metaphor for our relationship with Jesus? What if our intentional movement toward him propels us past his "event horizon," making the gravitational pull of his orbit feel like a tractor beam? And what if this close orbit of Jesus finally restores the intimacy with God we were created to enjoy?

When Jesus drove away all the crowds that had been following him by insisting that they "eat his body and drink his blood," he asked his closest friends if they were going to abandon him as well. Because Peter had already crossed his own event horizon with Jesus, he answered this way: "Lord, to whom would we go? You have words that give eternal life" (John 6:68).

This is the response of a black-hole disciple of Jesus—one who is "ruined by him, and ruined for him." That person's life, forever going forward, will be characterized by intimacy with Jesus. And that life is possible for you as well, if you will allow this journal to propel you past his event horizon.
